There are many words that can be easily confused.

Homographs are some these words! If you recall homographs are words that sound alike, but are spelled differently and have different meanings.

In this lesson we will gain an understanding of the easily confused words:

they're, there and their.

The words **their**, **there** and **they're** are used quite often in the English language.

We must learn to use the correct form which includes the correct spelling.





Let's begin by learning the
definition of these three words.

they're

there

their



They're

They're is a contraction for they are.

they + are = they're

Example:

They're (they are) going to run in the marathon next week.

They're (they are) the best of friends.



There

There refers to a place.

Example:

Please put all of your folders over **there**.

There used to be an ice cream shop where the art supply store is now.



Their

Is the **possessive** form of they (**belongs** to them).

Examples:

I can't wait to see **their** new car.

I really like **their** chocolate ice cream!

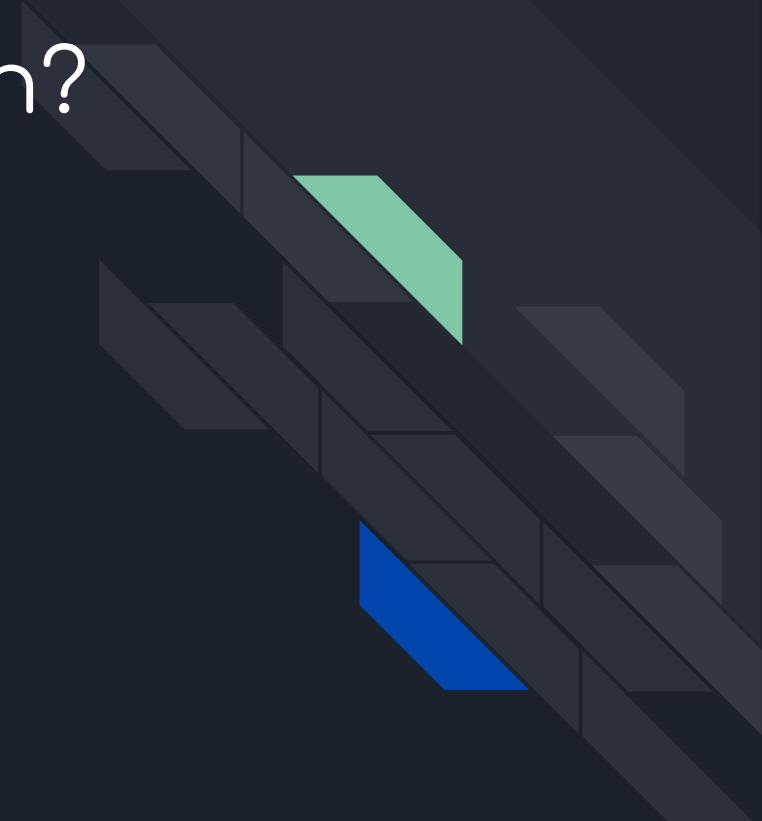
